Students must commit to at least one period 6 per week to help support lower school students.</p>
<p>C3 Subject Ambassadors</p> <p>Suitable for students looking to show their interest in a subject for UCAS and enhance their knowledge of a specific subject. Students must commit to at least one lunch time or study period to support a subject/activity.</p>	<p>C3 VI Form Counsellors</p> <p>Trained in listening skills, you will support other Beauchamps students</p>	<p>C3 Maths Buddy</p> <p>This is a great way to support lower school students by helping them develop their numeracy skills in Year 7/8. Students will need to commit to one support session per week</p>
<p>C3 Form Captain</p> <p>Support you're a lower school Form Tutor and take a lead in the form group, keeping them up to date on all school events.</p>	<p>C3 Senior Ambassadors</p> <p>An ideal opportunity for students looking to enhance their UCAS application and to demonstrate leadership skills. They lead a team of 75 plus ambassadors and senior prefects and lead on school initiatives like student voice as well as host events. Students must commit to school open days and meeting at least twice per term.</p>	<p>C3 Peer Mentor (Main School)</p> <p>A great way to work alongside Student Services to provide lower school students with a mentor to help them cope with the demands of school.</p>

- Afternoon Tea*


Each of the sessions will last for 3 weeks, and you will come out of your normal enrichment activity to attend.
