Admissions Policy Proposal for Beauchamps High School 2021/22

Where applications for admission exceed the number of places available the following criteria will be applied in the given order:

1. Looked After Children and previously looked after children #
2. Children with a sibling‡ attending the school
3. Children living in the priority admission area (which is those living with postcodes starting SS11 and SS12)
4. Any remaining places will be allocated by straight line distance* from the child's main address to the school.

In the event of oversubscription within any of the above criteria, straight line distance* will be used as a tie-breaker, with those living nearest to the school by straight line distance* having highest priority.

A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after ceased to be so because they were adopted or became subject to a child arrangement order or special guardianship order will be given first priority in the oversubscription criteria, ahead of all other applicants, in accordance with the School

Admissions Code 2014. A looked after child is a child who is (a) in the care of a local authority in England, or (b) being provided with accommodation by a local authority in England in the exercise of their social services functions (as defined in Section 22(1) of the Children Act 1989).

‡ For applications made in the normal admission round a sibling is defined as a child living in the same family unit in the same family household and address as a child who attends the school in any year group at the time of application. This, therefore, includes brothers and sisters and step- brothers and sisters. In addition, biological siblings in any year group will be treated as siblings irrespective of place of residence.

*Straight line distance is measured from the address point of the home address to address point of the school. Distances are reported in miles to three decimal places. If a child's time is split equally between two residences, the address of the residence at which the child resides for the majority of the school week would be used to measure the distance between the child's school and home.
